This demand is especially true for those who have been blessed with great wealth. The wealthy have benefited greatly in our times and it is right and just to ask that they share their resources so that our society may prosper. This is why as clergy, people of faith, and people of good will, we are calling for a Fair Tax in Illinois that asks those who have been blessed with great wealth to pay their fair share. Unfortunately, your organization has been at the forefront of a mis-information campaign to convince people to oppose the Fair Tax. This would lead either to drastic cuts in services for the most vulnerable members of our state or an increase in taxes on those who could least afford it.

We ask that you stop opposing a fair tax. Stand with us and support a constitutional amendment to allow a fair tax—with lower rates for lower incomes and higher rates for higher incomes.

A fair tax would provide resources for our schools and ensure that services to the vulnerable in our communities are maintained. A fair tax would stimulate economic growth, create jobs, and provide a means for Illinois to repair our crumbling infrastructure. A fair tax would provide desperately needed revenue for our state that has been lost because corporations have used loopholes to avoid paying their fair share.
