METHODOLOGY

800 registered voters in the state of Illinois were surveyed from June 26 - 29, 2023, with 70% of respondents sampled via text-to-web and matched to the voter file and 30% of respondents sampled via landline live caller and matched to the voter file.

The sample was weighted to population benchmarks for registered voters in the state of Illinois on gender, age, race/ethnicity, education, region, party, and 2020 vote. Estimates for gender, age, party, and region were derived from the L2 voter file. Estimates for race/ethnicity and education were derived from the US Census Bureau's American Community Survey demographic data adjusted to match voter registration estimates from the November 2020 Current Population Survey Voting and Registration Supplement.

The margin of error is +/- 4.6 percentage points.
